Step 1:

DISCOVER:

- Analyze the “Circulating Collectible Coin Redesign Act of 2020.” How did the law come into effect?
- Create 10 simple bookmarks, each with at least 3 unknown facts about one woman from the American Women Quarters program.
- Compare the American women’s quarter program to other countries’ representation of women on currency.

Step 2:

INVESTIGATE:

- Discuss how the representation of currency affects social perception.
- Explore the history of women’s representation in the U.S. Treasury and Mint
- Study the intersectionality of the women chosen for the women’s quarter program.

Step 3:

DESIGN:

- Create a piece of art inspired by a woman of the quarters
- Synthesize a woman’s story and impact into a Six-Word biography, then design a quarter on paper with whatever women you have chosen and write the words in a circular pattern around the quarter’s rim.
- Instead of designing a coin, design a postal stamp to accompany one woman’s quarters of your choice.

Step 4:

CONNECT:

- Make a 30-second elevator pitch about the American women’s quarters program. Then find peers, fellow scouts, or adults and deliver your pitch.
- Write a formal letter of appreciation to a local female leader. In the letter, include what you learned about the American Women’s Quarters program. As well as thanking the female leader for being an example of modern-day leadership.
- Present coins to younger scouts, peers, or siblings and help them identify the symbols on the coins and explain the significance.

Step 5:

TAKE ACTION:

- Lead a workshop for younger scouts about the women’s quarter
- Draft a 3-question survey about concepts of your choice that relate to the women’s quarter program. Then, have at least five people take your survey to collect data about how much individuals know about the program.
- Write a short letter to either a daisy or brownie that explains why learning about the women on these quarters made you feel confident and empowered, and lastly, give one piece of advice on “how to use your own voice.”

Disclaimer: For each step, only one option has to be completed out of the three.
